Students were given tools and strategies to strive towards peace. This month was also the start of a new program: Eco Eagles. We believe that instilling a sense of environmental responsibility in our students is one way for our students to help our world achieve peace.



Through our new EcoEagles program, our students and families can be involved in work that is meaningful and purposeful. Some of the initiatives include properly sorting and disposing of recyclable materials at home and at school. We are asking our families to collect plastic bottles and bring them to school every Monday for recycling where they will be taken to a recycling center weekly. Students will also reduce energy consumption, conserve water, and minimize waste on campus. These initiatives will be integrated into our daily life at school to educate our students about the environmental impact of their actions. Lastly, we ask our families to collect and save your bottle caps, and bring them to the classroom.

In May, we will be embarking on an exciting mural art project that will be repurposing the bottle caps into a collective art piece that will be displayed in our school.

TALAR KEOSEYAN

AGM students met Talar Keoseyan, author of *Tigran's Song* and *Our Tigran*. During the 2020 Artsakh war, Talar had seen a video of Tigran Harutyunyan, an Armenian solider singing a song he dedicated to his mother. Unfortunately, Tigran was martyred shortly after releasing that video, but Talar and Tigran's family wanted to ensure that Tigran's legacy would live on. Talar shared his story with us and we even had the privilege to be able to video call with Tigran's sister, Anna. Some students also had an opportunity to win one of the books to take home! *Our Tigran*, and *Tigran's Song* feature collected stories from Tigran's family and friends that paint a picture of who Tigran was and helps the reader connect to one of our nation's heroes.

Nora Bairamian, co-author of the *Great Armenians for Kids* books visited our school to talk about her latest book about Khrimyan Hayrik and all his contributions to the Armenian nation including the famous speech, τημωρξ ζτητιφ (Iron Ladle). The lower elementary students, after learning about Khrimyan Hayrik, created a portrait of him using colorful paper. The older elementary students had a fruitful discussion regarding what the Iron Ladle might look like for Armenia today.

To share her experience climbing Mount Ararat and to present her new book Դէպի Արարատ Լէռ, Meghri Der Vartanian visited our school all the way from the East Coast! In her book, Nate and Haig are determined to measure the height of Mount Ararat and come up with creative ways to figure it out. After the book reading, the younger students were engaged in a game that uses movement and imagination to climb Mount Ararat. The older students got to see a first look into what it takes to climb Mount Ararat and how they can be prepared to one day do it themselves! Students also learned new songs, poems, and valuable lessons about being proud to be Armenian, something that they will cherish forever!

SPOTLIGHT ORIORT TSOLAIRE TAMOUKIAN

WHAT IS YOUR OVERALL APPROACH TO TEACHING PRESCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN?

I love to work with preschool-aged children not only because it's fun and they are just the best humans on earth, but also because I get to instill all the things they learn in their early stages of life and teach them what they need to learn to move on to Kindergarten. The best part of being a teacher is when I see that they have learned something new and, they tell me or show me! Best thing ever for a teacher!

CAN YOU SHARE SOME WAYS OF HOW YOU INTEGRATE ACADEMIC SKILLS (IN ARMENIAN AND ENGLISH) INTO EVERYDAY ACTIVITIES?

In Preschool, I do every lesson in Armenian and English. I want to be sure children are ready for Kindergarten! We read books, write our names, and do activities both in Armenian and English. Before they leave my class, children are counting, recognizing letters and sounds, and are ready socially to head on over to Kindergarten.

HOW DO YOU INVOLVE PARENTS IN THEIR CHILD'S LEARNING & DEVELOPMENT?

I always like to involve parents by communicating and giving the kids homework assignments to practice at home too. For example, if we are learning letter sounds, I have them practice at home too, or if we are talking about kindness, practice ways of being kind at home. School and home should be on the same page for the child to grow and flourish!



WHAT DO YOU THINK ARE THE BIGGEST STRENGTHS OF THE AGM PRESCHOOL?



AGM preschoolers are very lucky to have a preschool where teachers are the sweetest and love doing what they do and it shows in their work! AGM is like home away from home. We are one big happy Armenian family, and we love all the children in our care. Our strengths are we value our culture and want to instill all that we can into our young Eagles.

WHAT STRATEGIES DO YOU USE TO PROMOTE SOCIAL-EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT AMONG YOUR PRESCHOOLERS?

Some strategies that I use to help with social-emotional development in our class is being a positive role model and showing kindness to the kids throughout the day. We talk about everything! I always use examples of how we might feel when someone does something hurtful to us or treats us in a way we don't like. We use art to express our feelings, we talk to one another if we don't like what the other person did or said to us, and different activities to show how we feel.

HOW DO YOU BALANCE STRUCTURED ACTIVITIES AND FREE EXPLORATION IN THE CLASSROOM?

Our daily routine is structured where we have time to learn during circle time and time to learn during free play. We have 2 different times of learning: one is circle time when the child learns to sit, listen to the teacher, listen to other students, read books, learn our letters and numbers, and the second is when we have free play we learn during different types of play.
